Fluoride

Fluoride contains fluorine, which is a naturally occurring element.

FLOURIDE HELPS PREVENT CAVITIES IN TWO WAYS



It hardens areas of the tooth that have been softened and weakened by acid released by cavity-causing bacteria in the mouth.

It directly inhibits the acid-producing bacteria responsible for producing cavities.

The American Dental Association recommends a professional cleaning and fluoride application for your child twice a year. If your child has areas of decay, a nightly fluoride mouthwash may be helpful. Community fluoridation (in the water supply) has also been a useful tool in decreasing decay levels in the population.

If you are served by a water system listed below, the water you receive contains fluoride in the optimal amount needed to improve oral health and reduce dental caries (cavities).
